Immanuel's Backpack Project will give packs full of school supplies to two elementary schools, who give them to children in need. Lights for St. Luke's Hospital in Gaza – Update

Alongside Hope is working to provide 407 solar panels for St. Luke's Hospital in the West Bank. The total cost will be \$176,000.

The hospital is operated by the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem. It serves about 455,000 Palestinians, including 57 marginalized villages and four refugee camps. An unreliable power grid and expensive fuel makes delivering health care a challenge during the best of times, and a crisis during the worst of times.

Alongside Hope has already raised enough to pay for 165 of the panels. Can you help with this project? Every gift, large or small, will be matched by a generous donor. You may recall that as a result of many women wearing a hat on Mothers' Day, Immanuel donated \$425.

Donation to Venezuela relief

Immanuel has sent a \$200 donation to Alongside Hope for disaster relief following the earthquakes in Venezuela. This money will be matched, up to \$2 million, by the federal government. This match is for donations made between June 25 and July 14.
