Light for St. Luke's Hospital

Immanuel has sent \$425, (raised by Sandi Nicholson and Marilyn Forster in response to their challenge for all women to wear hats on Mothers' Day) to Alongside Hope for their **Light for St. Luke's** campaign. The Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem operates St. Luke's Hospital in the West Bank. It serves about 455,000 Palestinians, including 57 marginalized villages and four refugee camps. An unreliable power grid and expensive fuel makes delivering health care a challenge during the best of times, and a crisis during the worst of times.

Light for St. Luke's aims to raise \$352,000 to install 407 solar panels. A generous donor has stepped forward to match up to half of that amount, meaning that only \$176,000 needs to be raised by parishes and individuals donating to Alongside Hope.
